

Updated Country Eligibility List, Global Financing Facility Strategy 2026–2030

Effective January 1, 2026

As part of the development of its strategy for 2026–2030, the Global Financing Facility (GFF) has updated its country eligibility list to reflect changes in the global burdens of maternal and child mortality and has classified countries by their relative burdens to guide future support. The new eligibility list and classifications ensure that the GFF remains focused on countries with the highest maternal and child mortality and where intensified support is needed to address critical bottlenecks and accelerate progress on health and nutrition outcomes for women, children, and adolescents. Taken together with an assessment of countries' potential for reform, the burden analysis that underpins the eligibility list and classifications will enable the GFF to prioritize, target, and differentiate future investments toward the highest-impact opportunities.
