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Situation Analysis

Things to consider

It is recommended that any Results Framework should have:

- 1. Indicators that measure steps / milestones of the Theory of Change
 - a. Indicators are linked to activities which are funded
 - b. Indicators have data sources
 - c. Data sources provide monthly / quarterly /annual data (not data every 3-5 years)
- 2. Baseline data
- 3. Targets
 - a. Targets for the end of the Investment Case/Plan
 - b. Quarterly or annual targets to be regularly monitored
- 4. Data analysis and data use strategy
- 5. Data sharing agreement with country platform
- Reflecting on the requirements for a Results Framework, consider whether you have all these available for your national plan and Health Financing Strategy/Plan? Are there operational plans to meet those targets? If not, what would be needed (data, people, resources, etc.) to make this happen?
- Who do you anticipate will be accountable for most of the work to make sure this happens in your country?
